Webinar on “Best Practices, **“Evolving a harmonious blend of the two sciences, natural and humanistic”** jointly organized by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in association with “Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute, Belur Math, Howrah, West Bengal was held on 13^hAugust 2020, through video conferencing using Cisco Meet platform. 
- BP-1. Rural Living and Learning Experience (RLLE)

During the introduction of the Webinar Swami Atmapriyananda, Pro Chancellor and Swami Sarvottamananda, Vice Chancellor, Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute, Howrah, West Bengal, provided a glimpse on the history and achievements of the University. He stated that the University is a Multi-campus University devoted to teaching and research in a variety of unique areas that are scarcely addressed by any of the conventional Universities in India. Apart from creating new knowledge through innovation and research, the University cultivates social responsibility to impact and enhance the quality of life of all sections of the society, particularly the under privileged and the marginalized. The themes of best practice was Rural Living and Learning Experience (RLLE) which primarily focus on rural immersion programme promoting alternative pedagogical approach through prolonged village-stay of the students and their professional services to the rural community.



It was elaborated during the session that the University is having a sustainable plant tissue culture unit to support teaching, research and extension, Organic farming centre devoted to bio-molecular research and extension services to the farming community. Empowering Youth through Education and Skill (EYES), Teaching, Research, Extension through Alternate Techniques (TREAT) continuity,

adaption, and innovation during the Covid-19 pandemic lockdown were the key highlights of their best practices presentation.



In the next session the focus was on capacity building by parents in reducing mal-adaptive behaviors of children with intellectual disabilities and pre-vocational training for developing effective transition skills for persons with disabilities etc. One of the best practices of the institution was imparting fluency in spoken Sanskrit and facility in flawless written Sanskrit (including composing poems extemporaneously) to students coming with absolutely no Sanskrit background after their ‘plus two’ course through a unique weekly programme called **“maanasollaasaah”** wherein the students develop their communication skills in Sanskrit through extempore speech, composition, drama, songs, etc, The Interactive Session was moderated by Prof. Amiya Kumar Rath, Adviser, NAAC and clarifications and queries raised by participants regarding various aspects were addressed by the Resource Persons and from NAAC as well. Welcome of Resource Persons of this Webinar was done by Dr. Ruchi Tripathi, Assistant Adviser, NAAC, Finally, the Best Practices Webinar was concluded with Vote of Thanks delivered by Dr. Neelesh Pandey, Assistant Adviser, NAAC.
