BEST PRACTICES ADOPTED BY A++ HEI's


**PIVOTAL OF TEACHER EDUCATION: IMPACT OF



He has clearly explained the differences between practices and facilities. The process and evaluation procedure to be involved in adopting the best practices and also he commented on self evaluation process to arrive at best of best practices.



Dr. N. Priya Narayanan, Assistant Adviser, NAAC., introduced all the three Panelists viz Dr. G. Subramonian, Principal, Dr. M. Jagadesh, IQAC Coordinator and Dr. S. Swaminathan, Librarian/Placement Coordinator of Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education (Autonomous), Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu., all of them presented their institutional best practices.
