A webinar on Best Practices adopted by A++ HEI's titled, 'Pivotal of Teacher Education: Impact of innovative practices', was jointly organized by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu, on 14th August 2020, through video conferencing using Cisco Webex Meet platform.

The webinar was organized with the aim of taking innovative initiatives to Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) for quality improvements and quality sustenance and to propagate knowledge on latest procedures involved in implementing Best Practices and innovative teaching methodologies. 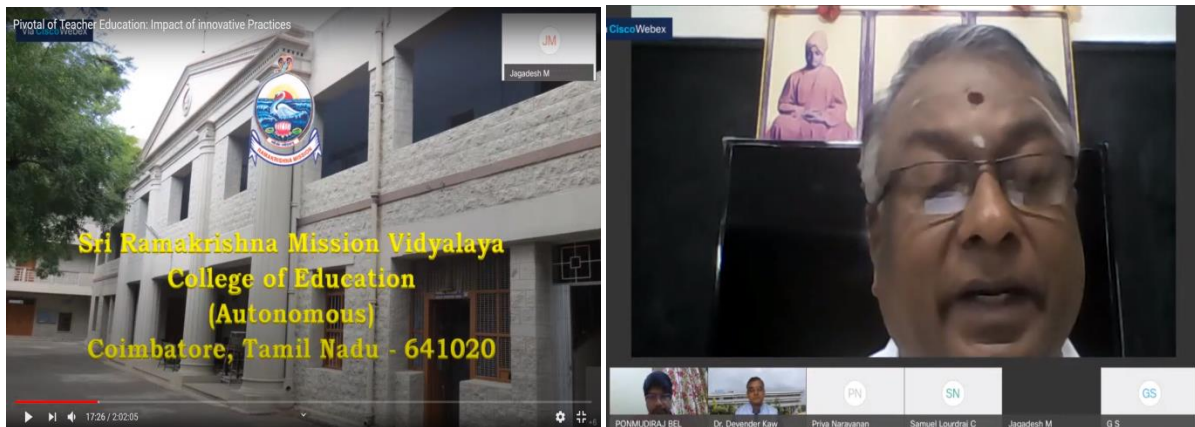

He mentioned that this was the 9th webinar in the series and a total of 85 webinars will be held on different themes in due course. While he explained the differences between practices and facilities, he also talked about the processes and evaluation procedures involved in adopting best practices. He emphasized the importance of the self evaluation process for the successful implementation of best practices.

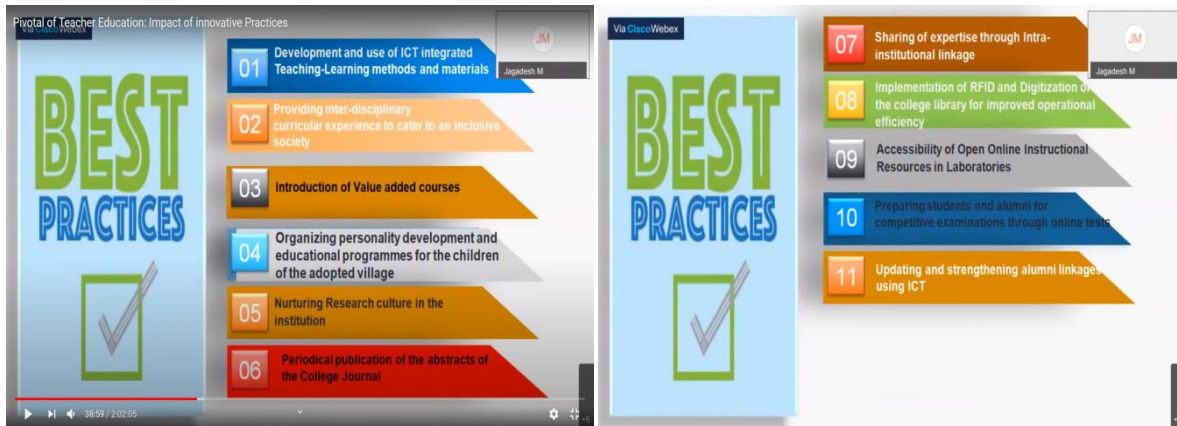


Dr. N Priya Narayanan, Assistant Adviser, NAAC, introduced all the panelists -- Dr. G. Subramonian, Principal, Dr. M. Jagadesh, IQAC Coordinator and Dr. S. Swaminathan, Librarian/Placement Coordinator of Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education (Autonomous), Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu. The panelists presented the best practices specific to their institutions.

Dr. G. Subramonian sought the blessings of Ramakrishna Paramahansa, Matha Sharadha Devi and Swamy Vivekananda, before beginning his speech. He gave a brief overview of Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya College of Education, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu. He recalled that the founding stone for the institution was laid by Rashtra Pitha Mahathma Gandhi. He mentioned that the college was the first in India to obtain autonomous status in the year 1981-82. He proudly mentioned that the teaching learning process, rubrics and evaluation process practiced by the college were on par with standards set by the assessment bodies. Prof. Subramonian deliberated on the eleven best practices followed by the college.



Dr. M. Jagadesh, Assistant Professor and IQAC Coordinator, highlighted the institution's unique initiatives that contribute towards quality output in the form of eminent teachers, equipped with the latest pedagogic methods and ICT tools. He also detailed the facilities available at the college like, EDUSAT Laboratory, Educomp Smart Class Lab, Library and Information Centre, Educational Psychology Laboratory, Educational Technology Laboratory, Computer Laboratory with internet connectivity, Language lab, Mathematics lab, Biology lab, Physical Science Lab, History and Commerce resource centers.

Swaminathan, Librarian/Placement Coordinator, explained the library vision for realizing missions of the institution and to give best digital library facilities to students. He also gave an overview of the library, the ICT enabled teaching methodologies and the role of alumni in enriching the knowledge of current students.
